Sent-Down Youth Project Overview:

The Golden Gate Symphony Orchestra & Chorus commemorates one of the largest misguided movements in human history, when nearly 20 million young people were forced to relinquish their youth to Mao Zedong's Cultural Revolution in China. The "Sent-Down Youth Movement", full of idealism and darkness, touched millions of Chinese lives, yet today is still largely unknown in the Western non-Chinese community.

The *Sen- Down Youth Intercultural Exchange* commemorates the 50th anniversary of the movement and includes a performance of *Ask the Sky and the Earth*, a classical oratorio-cantata written for full orchestra and chorus to celebrate the event. The piece will feature an intercultural chorus of more than 100 Chinese and Western singers, performing side-by-side in an inter-cultural celebration of a generation that gave its youth to the Cultural Revolution.

Ask the Sky and the Earth has been performed in venues all over the world, including Carnegie Hall, but the Golden Gate Symphony Orchestra & Chorus is proud to be the first independent cultural organization in the Western world to mount the work.
